### A Child Explains God



## **Did You Know?**

We begin our worship as a gathered community by praising God in song.

The Collect for Purity is an English rendering of a Latin prayer that began the liturgy in the medieval church before the Reformation.

song of praise, centers the service on EUCHARIST the God we gather to praise in our worship. During the summer months, Organist Brandon Woody has chosen hymns for the Gloria.

The collect is the prayer appointed for each Sunday that "collects" or captures the theme of the day or season of the Church year. It summarizes the attributes of God as revealed in the scriptures for the day.

The first reading is typically from the Old Testament (Hebrew Scriptures) which Jesus knew and from which he often referred or quoted.

The psalms are prayers that Jesus used and cover every mood of humanity's relationship with God and one another.

The second reading, taken from the New Testament, is typically from a letter (epistle) to the early Church, the Acts of the Apostles, or the Revelation to John.

The sequence hymn moves us toward the summit of the Liturgy of the Word—the reading of the Holy Gospel. Gospel means "good news"-specifically the "good news of Jesus."

The Gospel reading is taken from one of the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John), which depict the life, teachings, death, resurrection, and ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. We stand for the Gospel reading to show the particular importance placed on Jesus' words and actions.

The sermon directly follows the Gospel because it is to be grounded in the scriptures. It illuminates the scriptural readings and relates them to daily life.


