Preparing the Penitent for Joy of Easter

Epiphany not only marks the end of the Christmas season, but it also marks the beginning of the pre-Lenten period — sometimes called Carnival.

Since the forty days of Lent — not counting Sundays — would be a solemn time of penance and prayer, Carnival would provide one last time for joyous celebration.

The final day of Carnival is the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday — sometimes called Shrove Tuesday. The word "shrove' is the past tense of the Old English verb "shrive," which means to hear confession and to grant absolution.

On the morning of Shrove Tuesday, people were expected to confess their sins and to be "shriven." Since no meats were to be eaten during Lent, housewives would cook up all the fats to make pancakes and thereby creating the custom of eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday.

Mardi Gras is the term used by the French settlers in Louisiana for Shrove Tuesday. Ash Wednesday ends the Carnival season and officially begins Lent. Like Good Friday, Ash Wednesday is observed as a fast in the Episcopal Church.

The forty days of Lent are believed to symbolize

the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness in fasting and prayer after his baptism. Hence, Lent is to a time of fasting, selfdenial, and prayer.



The word "Lent" comes from "Lengtentide," the Old English word for spring.

Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday are considered moveable feast days — their dates depend on the date of Easter.

The liturgical color for Lent is purple, symbolizing penitence.

Solemn Service Begins Lent



Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, will be observed with the service of Holy Eucharist and Imposition of Ashes on February 26 at 6:00 pm.

During the service, worshippers will be invited to come to the altar where The Rev. Joe Coo-

per will use ashes to impose, or mark, the sign of the cross on their foreheads.

The use of ashes this way reminds the worshippers of their mortality and their penitence.

In practice since the ninth century, imposition of ashes recalls those times when people who repented of their sins would scatter themselves with ashes and dress in sackcloth.

It was customary in the very early Roman Catholic Church to use ashes from burning the palms blessed on Palm Sunday of the previous year.

To emphasize the austerity of the day and the coming of Lent, the entrance rite will be omitted.

The altar will be bare in appearance with only a minimal of ecclesiastical appointments in use.

supper of salad, soups, and sandwiches.


Brandon will also lead a Bible study in preparation for Lent.


