Lent has arrived

This year, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 1st.

Lent has been observed by Christians since the fourth century. It is a time of reflection, penitence and spiritual renewal before Easter.

Lent ends at midnight on Holy Saturday, the night before Easter Sunday.

During Lent some Christians focus on giving up something.

Is it absolutely necessary for the observation of Lent to give up a delicacy or a bad habit or an hour of sleep in order to pray? Who can truly say?

What one does during the Lenten period should be a matter between a Christian and God.

Some may decide to do something extra for their spiritual growth. Others may indeed 'give up' something that's a hindrance to the spiritual life.

Some may make a special sacrifice of

some sort.

And some may decide to improve their communication and fellowship with God by having special times of prayer throughout the day, or vow to worship in the church at every service held.

The important thing is to make Lent a special time, a memorable time. A time so meaningful that it sets the tone for the rest of the entire year.

At the very least it should be a time of sincere spiritual growth.

Lent at Church of the Advent

The forty days of Lent are believed to symbolize the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness in fasting and prayer after his baptism.

The word "Lent" comes from "Lengtentide," the Old English word for spring.

The liturgical color for Lent is purple, Continued on page #2 Continued from page #) symbolizing penitence — the same as for Advent.

The altar will be bare in appearance with only a minimal of ecclesiastical appointments in use.

Services during Lent — Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, and Holy Eucharist—will be Rite I.

The traditional language rites are known as Rite I, and the contem-

porary language rites are known as Rite 2.

The Rite 1 liturgies reflect the language and piety of the Elizabethan era and the first Book of Common Prayer although the structure of these liturgies also reflects the influence of modern liturgical scholarship.

The Foundation was established to help donors build endowments to support community needs in Martin County through grants to nonprofit groups.


